#### **President's Report**

2017 was another busy year for the Children's center – in fact every year is busy. Here's some of what was going on:

22 children participated in our autism programs.
67 children participated in our behavior support programs.
30 children received child care or specialized child care.
81 children received occupational therapy.
64 children received special education services.
84 children received speech and language therapy.
164 children received case management services.
42 children received mental health services with a clinician.

2017 also saw the completion of our new playground. This playground has been a much worked for and long awaited project. For five years, we fundraised for it. We spent a year planning for it-stretching every penny to create an inclusive play space for children with all types of challenges cognitive, sensory, emotional, and physical. All children can play and learn from each other in all areas of the playground. To my knowledge, there is no other inclusive play space like it in Maine.

We also opened a new site in Farmington. For years there has been no center based services for youth and children with special needs in Franklin County. We're there in the Fairbanks school providing services to more children than we projected. We're also providing case management services to children in that area.

Our work is not possible without our committed volunteer board, our amazing and talented staff, volunteers, and community sponsors. On behalf of the children and families we serve, I want to thank you all very much. What a remarkable year The Children's Center has had! I have had the honor to serve as this year's President of the Board of Directors and I am so proud of the incredible accomplishments this organization has achieved!

We now house a one of a kind, all inclusive playground in Augusta! This allows every one of our kids to participate in playground activities! The value of our children interacting, growing and learning together has now moved outdoors! The kids absolutely love the new playground, as does our staff, so stop by and see for yourself soon!

The Children's Center has successfully brought a new classroom, affectionately known as "The Birches"! This investment positions us to respond to the growing needs for our services!

I want to thank the staff of The Children's Center, because they are truly Angels among us! Their passion to serve and their incredible compassion shown to the children is truly awe inspiring! When stories are told about the amazing growth and development of our kids, it waters the eyes and warms the heart!
